

Russ Havard is drawn towards nature imagery that depicts isolated elements in their continual struggle to flourish under desolate circumstances. The seemingly bleak, the empty landscape, speaks to him according to the artist. It is in this silence that he sees the neverending waves of struggle, wearing down, and rebirth emerging.

The process of endless building and reconfiguring transcends the mere physical and encompasses the spiritual and symbolic. In what some see as mere desolation, he finds a spark of the sublime: a release into a quiet revelry, and a peace that covers it all. By making paintings and constructions, he takes part in a restoration process. It is an act of reclamation and pressing onward.

Russ Havard grew up in Lufkin, Texas. He attended Stephen F. Austin State University where he received a BFA in and 1993 and went on to receive an MA in 1997. Havard has exhibited extensively throughout Texas and the United States. His work has been featured in New American Paintings, Vols. 30 and 48. Russ Havard currently lives and works in Texas.
