

RANDALL MOOERS

Ontology

Randall Mooers has created a body of still life paintings that showcases his love of objects and his ability to paint them as truthfully as possible.

"I'm inspired by Dutch still life painting," says Mooers. "I want these paintings to be very naturalistic. Verisimilitude is a goal of mine."

Mooers spends anywhere from three hours to three days setting up the intricate and complex compositions in these still lifes—a composition that focuses on a love for the objects and the emotion created by the placement of them.

"I'm not generally thinking about what it is that I'm after," says Mooers. "It's just a general feeling that as I work becomes more specific. I love spatial relationships and the tension that you can create between objects. It's called *ontology* and it is the study of objects and how they relate to one another."

While Mooers is inspired by Dutch still life painting, he feels that his work, while visually similar, is actually quite different than that of the Old Masters.

"I don't like to find any meaning," says Mooers. "I want to get away from what they did. I want to let the viewer have their own subjective experience. Objects mean something different to everybody. What I'm interested in is creating a visual dynamic that is interesting and has a sense of visual tension to it as well." Mooers' still lifes vary from being up close and in the face of the viewer to others that pull back and show the entire composition and table that the multiple objects are resting on.

"When I pull back I think that it gives the painting a sense of stability," says Mooers. "But when I go in close they are more chaotic. Up close, they are also less formal and the configurations take longer to compose. They are also more complex in terms of shapes, colors and the way the eye moves around them as well."
